Club/Facility Rules

I. Clubhouse & Grounds Operations

The Clubhouse will be open daily with the exceptions of Monday's, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve, & Christmas Day. The Clubhouse may also be closed at times due to severe weather conditions. In the winter, the clubhouse may also be closed on spells where the temperatures drop below 40 degrees.

Hours vary by season. Please check with the shop for current hours of operation.

The course is open anytime the sun is up and closed as soon as the sun is down. No course or clubhouse access will be allowed once the sun has set unless the club is conducting a designated event that extends into that time period. Due to liability concerns, all traffic must vacate the premises at dark. No exceptions.

It is understood that course maintenance staff will have priority on the weekdays and players must give way. Does not apply on the weekends, if work is necessary.

II. Club Policies

The club is intended for private use of its members, their family, and guests. Children are covered by their parent's membership until their 22nd birthday unless they are still enrolled as a full time student at a higher learning facility. Grandchildren are also permitted to enjoy their grandparent's membership until their 18th birthday.

The board of directors or club operator, from time to time, may authorize different areas of the club to be used exclusively by a member or an outside group but any area of the club set aside for exclusive use shall be subject to club rental fees.

Members are expected to be properly attired for the activity in which they are engaged. Members are expected to wear shirts at all times when in the clubhouse. Bathing suits must be covered and shoes must be worn anytime you are inside the Pro Shop, Grill, or bathrooms. Members are expected to wear golf attire, or the like, when on the golf course even if they had just finished swimming.

III. Member Conduct

The conduct of any members and/or their guests while using the clubs facilities shall be the responsibility of the primary membership holder. Misconduct will include, but not be limited to:

- Profanity or general behavior deemed inappropriate for a family oriented facility.
- Loud and/or extreme boisterous conduct
- Personal confrontations or berating of any club personnel
- Personal confrontations or berating of any other club member, event holder, or guests
- Any other actions that would infringe upon the enjoyment, use, or welfare of others or the club itself.

IV. Rule Enforcement

It is the responsibility of club management to represent the Board of Directors in the enforcement of club rules. Any efforts to circumvent club management will be met with immediate reinforcement of policy by the Board of Directors as we have tasked the managers to enforce our club policies, not their own personal policies.

V. Golf Course

These rules are to set standards for common courtesy and safety for all members. Members are urged to read and obey these rules. Members should explain these rules to their children, guests, and others so they have a complete and general understand of how to conduct themselves while on club grounds.

A. General Rules

All guests and spectators are required to check in with the proshop when able to do so. Players teeing off before the pro shop opens should check in at first opportunity to do so. The golf course closes at sun down.

All people on the golf course must wear appropriate golf attire at all times. Swimsuits, cutoffs, and gym shorts are not considered appropriate dress for the course.

Other than golf cars any vehicles, bicycles, rollerblades, sleds, atv's, side by sides are strictly forbidden unless given expressed permission from management.

Searching for lost balls or 'ball hawking' is forbidden. All lost/abandoned golf balls are deemed property of the club.

No joy riding, walking, jogging, etc. will be permitted on club grounds by anyone. With an active course and golf balls travelling in excess of 120mph, it simply too large of a safety concern.

Oklahoma Liquor Law OK Statute 37A-6-105 prohibits outside alcoholic beverages from being brought onto the premises. Glass containers are strictly prohibited anywhere on club grounds.

All dues and tabs held at the club must be kept current according to the clubs and operators' most current rules in regards to such. Member may lose club privileges for any club debt, including concession, goes unpaid or is not resolved in a timely manner (15 days) as in accordance with the clubs by-laws and operators most current rules in regard to such.

It is expected that if any member or their guest cause damage, accidental or not, to any personal property such as a car in the parking lot or window of a house, they must attempt to notify the owner or inform clubhouse staff immediately. A golfer is always responsible for their golf ball.

Please use clubhouse restrooms at all times while on property.

Music volumes must be kept a minimum, especially when around clubhouse area and must never contain profane or explicit lyrics and language. Please be considerate of those around you.

Members and their guests must respect homeowner boundaries. Please do not enter any private property surrounding the course without first gaining permission from the homeowner.

B. The Practice Green

Persons using the practice green are reminded that chip shots causing divots are strictly forbidden. The practice green is part of the golf course and should be treated with the same respect as all other course greens.

C. The Driving Range

Persons using the driving range should try to be aware of players coming up 2 and 4 fairways and make sure they do not put anyone in danger while practicing. Please give way to those players as they will most likely have their attention elsewhere while golfing.

While it can sustain light practice sessions, please understand during peak hours, its current capabilities are more suited to that of a warm-up range. Please be considerate of other members wanting to warm up for their round during these times by limiting the amount of balls hit to an acceptable amount needed to warm up.

D. Courtesy on the Course

In the interest of all, players should play without delay. Players searching for a balls should signal any players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found. They should not search for more than 3 minutes before doing so. They should not continue play until the players following them have passed and are out of range.

Any group falling a hole behind the group in front of them should let any waiting groups play through immediately.

Play coming off #9 green has the right-of-way on the #1 tee box, without exception.

No group, regardless of size, may cut off another group to start on the hole ahead of them. If any member of the group on the previous hole is inside the 150 yard pole on par 4 or 5's, or has left tee box on par 3's then you must wait or tee off in a different location, without exception.

Course 'skipping' for the enjoyment of all, is not allowed. Members may start their rounds on a hole other than #1 provided all the previous rules are followed but are not entitled to skip around the course to find open holes. Holes must be played concurrently. Skipping holes adds unnecessary wear and tear on the golf course and creates confusion among other groups. Players must play continuous holes from the time each of their 9 hole round is started until it is completed or the player leaves the grounds, without exception.

You will forfeit your place on the course if you vacate your position on the course or are in the clubhouse for an extended period of time. Extended periods, for this purpose, is defined as being longer than 3-5 minutes.

E. Priority on the Course

Larger groups of 4 or 5 have priority over all other groups. This means larger groups are not required or expected to let smaller groups play through as long as they are meeting expected pace of play requirements of 9 holes in 2 hours or 18 holes in 4 hours. While it may not be expected, members are encouraged to let faster groups play through when practical. Groups falling behind expected pace of play will be required to let all groups that come up to them regardless of size, play through. Groups of six (or more) may be permitted at times with permission from the manager but have no standing on the course and must let all groups play through.

F. Care for the Course

On the teeing area and through the green, players should avoid taking divots with practice swings and a player should ensure that any divots taken are replaced.

On the putting green, players should make sure all ball marks or spike marks are carefully repaired using USGA recommended practices. Caution should be used to ensure no damage is done to the hole when performing repairs or normal golf activities.

If a member or their guest should damage the course in any way out of anger, malice, or any other way not typical to normal golf behavior, that member may be subject to immediate discipline including but not limited to termination of membership.

G. Golf Cars

Players operating golf cars should drive on paths when applicable and in the rough when not, only driving into and out of fairways at a 90 degree angle.

Players are required to keep cars on trails within 30 yards of teeing grounds and greens complexes at all times. If needed, medical exceptions may be made by management. If you have not received medical clearance than you must abide by the 30 yard rule or risk losing cart and/or club privileges.

To reduce wear on the golf course, players are required to double up when in club rented carts and encouraged to ride together if both possess personal carts. This practice will significantly cut down on the amount of traffic the golf course has to take on a daily basis and will make a huge impact to overall turf quality. Remember, the by-laws state no more than 3 carts in a group are allowed. This rule will be enforced.

No car rental or personal car can have more than 2 adults in it unless it is specifically designed to accompany more than that. (I.e. a one seated cart is limited to 2 adults a 2 seated cart can fit 4.)

It is the liability of the primary membership holder for any damages done to club property, including any rental car or the course itself, by themselves or their guests. The club reserves the right to recoup any expenses incurred as the result of damage to or from a golf cart by a member, their family, or guests. The club will not be held responsible or liable for any accidents or damages.

H. Children on the Course

Children without a valid learners permit are prohibited from operating a cart on club grounds. No exceptions will be made to this rule unless the person is an employee of the club.

Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult member. It is recognized that some children in this age group are familiar with the rules of golf and golf etiquette; therefore, they may obtain special permission from the manager to operate under the rules of the following age group

Children 12-16 years of age can play without adult supervision on weekdays outside of peak times but must have an adult with them during peak weekend hours.

All groups with children 16 and under must let faster groups play through regardless of group size.

VI. Swimming Pool

The swimming pool will open for the season on the Saturday of the Memorial Day weekend and close for the season on Labor Day. During the swimming season the pool will be open daily from 11am to 7pm with the exception of being closed Mondays for routine maintenance.

Swimming is strictly prohibited after dusk.

Management and lifeguards have the final authority as to when it is safe for children to enter the pool. The mere threat of lightning is just cause to close the pool. Members must also remember it is the lifeguard's duty to ensure a safe swimming environment, not babysit. As a general rule, children not old enough to be left alone at home should not be left alone at the club unattended. State law dictates any child under the age of 12 must have an adult present if no lifeguard is on duty. In the event of a pool closure due to weather, parents should be prepared to pick up their children from the club.

All pool activities must be under supervision of the pool manager and lifeguards. All patrons must sign in upon arriving at the pool. Any guests must pay BEFORE enjoying pool and its amenities. If the guest fails to pay, the primary member will be charged for their guest.

Absolutely NO GLASS will be allowed anywhere near the pool area.

Unbecoming conduct at the pool will not be tolerated. Kids may be told to leave the pool for a determined amount of time for misbehaving. Children can also be sent home by either the lifeguard or management if they deem them unable to conduct themselves properly. All children must have an adult that is able to be contacted while at the pool. Misconduct could include but is not limited to the following:

1. Profanity
2. Disregarding the instructions or rules of the lifeguard and staff
3. Any actions that would infringe upon the enjoyment, use, or welfare of others
4. Any safety violations that may put any other swimmers in danger

VII. Lake/Fishing/Watercraft Rules

Swimming is prohibited in the lake

Only members may fish as long as it does not affect play. All fishing is catch and release ONLY.

Any member under the age of 18 is required to obtain permission from club management before fishing anywhere on property. Members must comply with all State and Federal laws and are responsible for acquiring the proper credentials.

Absolutely no public use of this area. Members Only.

No watercrafts will be allowed on the lake.

No hunting will be allowed on the property unless otherwise permitted by club management or its board of directors.

VIII. Guest Policies

Guests are limited to 6 visits per calendar year. The limit applies to all non-members living in the state of Oklahoma. Those persons living outside of the state are not subject to the limit. If not paid by the guest, all applicable guest fees and other charges will be charged to the primary member's account. Member accepts responsibility for their guest and their actions while on club grounds. A visit is deemed recorded when the guest pays to enjoy any amenities of the club not including fundraisers or league play.

Outside of applicable green fee and cart rental fees, guests will be charged \$5 to enjoy any other club amenity including the pool and driving range. This rate is subject to change. Non-members are welcome on the course Tuesdays-Fridays without a member.

Weekends and Holidays are reserved for members. Please understand, this is an attempt to ensure the course remains available for the enjoyment of the ever growing membership.
